

Requirements of the Psychology Major/Minor

The psychology major requires a total of 35 semester hours. Courses are divided into 3 categories: required courses, core courses, and electives. Required courses include 15 semester hours that must be taken in sequence (101, 201/202, and 420), as well as PSYCH 415 sometime in the junior or senior year. Majors are also expected to complete 12 semester hours in core courses, with at least two courses from the 300 level. Finally, majors are expected to complete 6 semester hours of electives, including at least one 300 level course. Elective courses are any of the following (250, 251, 282, 290, 345, 350, 351, 352) *or any core course after the core course requirement is completed.*

Psychology Minor:

A minor in psychology consists of a minimum of 19 semester hours, including: PSYCH 101, PSYCH 202, plus 4 core courses / electives (2 must exceed the 300 level).

Notes:

a Psych 101 is a pre-requisite for all other Psych courses.

b The department recommends taking the Research Methods sequence, Psych 201 and 202, during the sophomore year, although the junior year is acceptable also.

c Psych 415 is acceptable any time during the junior or senior years, and can be retaken for credit. Psych 201 and 202 are pre-requisites.

d The department strongly recommends taking MATH 106 (Elementary Statistics) *prior to* PSYCH 201.

Notes:

Off-Campus study is recommended for the fall of your junior year, but can be scheduled at other times. If you are interested in studying off-campus for a semester, be sure to take Psyc201 and Psyc202 in your sophomore year in order to make scheduling in your junior year more flexible.
